
Epiphany Home Blessing with Chalk

REMINDER Advent and Christmas Traditions from Around the World – La Griteria

La Griteria is celebrated throughout Nicaragua on December 8, at the end of the Novena to the Immaculate Conception. Hosts will move their altars to the sidewalk or street, and groups of people will gather and go around to the different altars while singing to the Virgin Mary. After a series of songs, the leader will shout: "Quien causa tanta alegria" (who causes so much joy) and everyone responds, "La Concepción de Maria" (The Conception of Mary). After the shouting, the hosts distribute goods, candies, fruits, etc. to the group of people who "Le Gritaron a La Virgen" (shouted to the Virgin Mary). The group of people then move to another altar and another group takes its place; this can continue until midnight. Some neighbourhoods will also set off fireworks to celebrate La Griteria. The Nicaraguan families of Nuestra Señora de La Asunción Parish will celebrate "The Griteria" on Sunday, December 8, after the 11 pm Mass at 200 Kenny St. in Winnipeg. They invite you and your friends and family to

come and celebrate with them.

REMINDER La Noche de la Velitas – Celebrated Traditionally in Columbia on the Eve of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception – La Virgen de Conception – December 7, 2024 The Columbian families of Nuestra Señora de La Asunción Parish will have a candlelight celebration, with electric candles and a Rosary on Saturday, December 7 at 6:30 pm, followed by a Mass at 7 pm. After Mass, hot chocolate and pan dulce will be shared.



UPDATED La Guadalupe – Celebrated in Mexico and in Latin America, as well as North America – December 12, 2024

Our Lady of Guadalupe (*Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe*), also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe Virgen de Guadalupe), is a title of Mary, Mother of Jesus associated with a series of five Marian apparitions to a Mexican peasant named Juan Diego and his uncle, Juan Bernardino, which occurred in December 1531, when the Mexican territories were under the Spanish Empire. A venerated image on a cloak (*tilmahtli*) associated with the apparition is enshrined within the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The basilica is the most-visited Catholic shrine in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site.

Come celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe on Thursday, December 12, at the 7 PM Mass at 200 Kenny St. in Winnipeg. They invite you and your friends and family to come and celebrate with them.

UPDATED Announcements for the Sundays of Advent connecting the theme of Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope and Advent

Here are announcements for Sundays of December 8, 15, 22 that link the theme of Advent to the pilgrimage of hope by reflecting on the journey of preparation, repentance, joy, and trust. Each Sunday invites parishioners to consider their role as pilgrims awaiting Christ's coming and encourages them to deepen their faith in anticipation of the Jubilee Year 2025. We hope that you will read them aloud as we draw near to the Year of Jubilee!

Sunday, December 8, 2024 - Second Sunday of Advent: Preparing the Way

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we continue our pilgrimage of hope, moving steadily toward the great feast of Christmas. As pilgrims, we are not only called to anticipate Christ's coming, but we are also invited to actively prepare the way for Him in our lives, just as John the Baptist did.

In today's Gospel (Luke 3:1-6), we hear the voice of John the Baptist calling out, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." His message is one of repentance, renewal, and hope. John was a pilgrim, too—one who lived in the wilderness, preparing the hearts of the people to welcome Christ. His message was a call to make a straight path for the Lord, to clear away the obstacles in our hearts that prevent us from receiving God's love and grace.

As we reflect on this, we are reminded that Advent is not just a season of passive waiting. It is an active time to clear our hearts, to remove the distractions and attachments that hinder us from fully encountering Christ. The Pilgrims of Hope are called to walk with purpose and intentionality, preparing the way for Jesus by turning to Him in prayer, in acts of charity, and in our desire to grow closer to Him.

This Advent, let us consider: What is God inviting me to clear from my life so that I can welcome Him more fully? What do I need to repent of, so that my heart can be a place where His love and grace can dwell? As we continue our pilgrimage, let us remember that preparation is not just about getting ready for a day, but about creating a space for God to work in us every day.



REMINDER Jubilee 2025 Pilgrims of Hope: What is a Jubilee Year?


A Jubilee Year is a significant period of celebration and forgiveness observed every 25 years in the Catholic Church. This sacred time provides a unique opportunity for spiritual renewal, where individuals and communities can reflect on their faith, seek forgiveness, and restore relationships. The essence of the Jubilee is rooted in the themes of mercy and hope, inviting everyone to partake in the grace of God and the joy of reconciliation. Pope Francis has called for a year of jubilee with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope" The 2025 Jubilee will officially open on December 24, 2024, at 19:00 with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square, Vatican City. The rite of the Opening of the Holy Door will follow. For the faithful around the world, the local diocesan Masses are to be held on December 29, 2024.

NEW "TEACH US TO PRAY" - Document in Preparation of Jubilee 2025

A Brief Introduction - As we move closer to the Jubilee of 2025, Pope Francis wants 2024 to be dedicated to prayer. Thus, he is inviting the whole Church to a time of intense commitment in preparation for the Opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's in Rome, on December 24.

The Jubilee will involve not only the city of Rome, but will extend far beyond, as God's mercy is proclaimed to the whole world, thus becoming a great opportunity for evangelization. As Christians, we are invited to bear witness as authentic "Pilgrims of Hope" walking toward the Lord, who opens his merciful and forgiving arms to us, as well as to our brothers and sisters who are still waiting for the Gospel to be proclaimed to them.

Prepared by the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization, "Teach Us to Pray", is a resource aide, inspired by the magisterium of Pope Francis, intended to be used by the faithful during this time of preparation for the opening of the Holy Door. It is an invitation to intensify prayer as a personal dialogue with God.

To help us all prepare for Jubilee 2025, the **Weekly News Bulletin** will be offering tips drawn from **Teach Us to Pray**. This week, we focus on **Retreats on Prayer**...

Jesus "Went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed." (Mk 1:35). Mark gives us an image of Jesus that points to two essential dimensions of Christian prayer: removing oneself from the daily routine - necessary for seeking personal dialogue with the Father – and a silent heart - indispensable for listening for God's voice and hearing what He wants. In this perspective, a spiritual retreat can provide an unparalleled opportunity for spiritual conversion and a renewal of heart to which we have all been invited by the Holy Father.

Participating in a spiritual retreat is a great opportunity to experience the Lord's presence more fully through common life and prayer shared during retreat days. A spiritual retreat is not an escape from reality, but rather a fuller immersion into reality through the silence of prayer. The fruit of an authentic spiritual retreat will be a new light transforming everyday life by the presence of the Lord. In a world that often distracts us and pulls us away from our life of faith, a prayer retreat is like stopping at an oasis in a desert. Our cities, although full of ways and opportunities for encounters, often shroud or hide from view the true source of hope, the fount of joy that only the Lord can give us.

NEW WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will be celebrated in many places around the world from **January 18 - 25, 2025**. The resources for 2025 have been prepared by the community of Bose, an ecumenical monastery of brothers and sisters in northern Italy, and by the international Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Writing Team. The theme chosen is "**Do you believe this?**" (John 11:26). 2025 marks the 1,700th anniversary of the first Christian Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, near Constantinople in 325 AD. This commemoration provides a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians, as expressed in the Creed formulated during this Council, a faith that remains alive and fruitful in our time. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 offers an invitation to draw on this shared heritage and to enter more deeply into the faith that unites all Christians.

NEW National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples - December 12, 2024

To mark the National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples, which takes place on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadelupe, the Canadian Catholic Indigenous Council (CCIC) recalls the profound sorrow expressed by Pope Francis, during his Penitential Pilgrimage to Canada in July 2022, for the catastrophic effects of the residential school system on Indigenous communities, as well as the journey of reconciliation and healing we have embarked upon together. Two years later, the Pope's words still compel us to recognize this painful legacy and walk alongside the Indigenous Peoples in a spirit of repentance, solidarity, and hope. We contemplate the Holy Father's words: "The Church is the house where we conciliate anew, where we meet to start over and to grow together". This vision of the Church as a "living body of reconciliation" has guided us in our ongoing commitment to justice and healing. Together we pray:

O God, Creator and Father of all, with humility and hope, we, your children, acknowledge the relationship in You of all living things. For this we thank You and praise You. We call on You, Great Mystery, our God who comes to us in Jesus Christ, Your Son – our Lord, teacher, prophet and brother – to open our minds and hearts as we continue to walk the difficult, yet critical journey of reconciliation and healing. In our world of such blessed diversity, we see so many struggles and obstacles to oneness and unity. We implore You to heal our brokenness and division. Show us in Jesus the way to unity among the multiplicity of Your peoples in our world. We also pray that You will guide and lead us in the Truth, and show us how to be a people who walk with You. May we be a people of Respect, Humility, Courage, Honesty, and Compassion - as we find Your Wisdom on the Spirit-led journey that supports deep healing and fosters renewed relationships. Lord, make us channels of Your Peace, Hope, and Love! +Amen



REMINDER "For the Love of the Creator's Land and People" - New Diocesan Land Acknowledgement

The Archdiocese of St. Boniface is happy to present its new Diocesan Land Acknowledgement, titled "Shaawiintan Manitou akii tako opimaatisii", which means "For the Love of the Creator's Land and People" in Anishinaabeg. The land acknowledgement has been crafted with the assistance of the Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba, and has wonderful artwork by Roslyn Boucha, a Anishinaabe / German Settler artist of the Animakee Wa Zhing FIrst Nation. This artwork was originally commission during the 2022-23 school year by the Manitoba Catholic Schools.

This is Roslyn's description of the artwork:

"This illustration is my love letter to the land just as I believe a land acknowledgement should be; an act of reciprocity and a commitment to care for the land just as the land cares for us. Referencing the woodland art style, I included flora and fauna from across Turtle Island that has been integral to Indigenous groups since time immemorial, as well as cultural references to First Nations, Inuit, and our Metis relatives. The overall shape of the design references water as our life giver, flowing from the bottom of the page through to the infinity symbol and Creator's eye at the centre of the star blanket. I chose not to include human shapes in this piece. Not because we are not an integral part of this system, but because we are included as the viewer, within the words, and within the shapes and stories throughout the image. A gentle reminder that we are not separate from the land. We are the land and this story is about us."
