


Epiphany Home Blessing with Chalk

NEW Advent and Christmas Traditions from Around the World – La Griteria

La Griteria is celebrated throughout Nicaragua on December 8, at the end of the Novena to the Immaculate Conception. Hosts will move their altars to the sidewalk or street, and groups of people will gather and go around to the different altars while singing to the Virgin Mary. After a series of songs, the leader will shout: "Quien causa tanta alegria" (who causes so much joy) and everyone responds, "La Concepción de Maria" (The Conception of Mary). After the shouting, the hosts distribute goods, candies, fruits, etc. to the group of people who "Le Gritaron a La Virgen" (shouted to the Virgin Mary). The group of people then move to another altar and another group takes its place; this can continue until midnight. Some neighbourhoods will also set off fireworks to celebrate La Griteria. The Nicaraguan families of Nuestra Señora de La Asunción Parish will celebrate "The Griteria" on Sunday, December 8, after the 11 pm Mass at 200 Kenny St. in Winnipeg. They invite you and your friends and family to

come and celebrate with them.

NEW La Noche de la Velitas – Celebrated Traditionally in Columbia on the Eve of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception – La Virgen de Conception – December 7, 2024

The Columbian families of Nuestra Señora de La Asunción Parish will have a candlelight celebration, with electric candles and a Rosary on Saturday, December 7 at 6:30 pm, followed by a Mass at 7 pm. After Mass, hot chocolate and pan dulce will be shared.





NEW La Guadalupe – Celebrated in Mexico and in Latin America, as well as North America – December 12, 2024

Our Lady of Guadalupe (*Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe*), also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe Virgen de Guadalupe), is a title of Mary, Mother of Jesus associated with a series of five Marian apparitions to a Mexican peasant named Juan Diego and his uncle, Juan Bernardino, which occurred in December 1531, when the Mexican territories were under the Spanish Empire. A venerated image on a cloak (*tilmahtli*) associated with the apparition is enshrined within the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The basilica is the most-visited Catholic shrine in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site.

Come celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe on Tuesday, December 12, at the 7 PM Mass at 200 Kenny St. in Winnipeg. They invite you and your friends and family to come and celebrate with them.



REMINDER "For the Love of the Creator's Land and People" - New Diocesan Land Acknowledgement

The Archdiocese of St. Boniface is happy to present its new Diocesan Land Acknowledgement, titled "Shaawiintan Manitou akii tako opimaatisii", which means "For the Love of the Creator's Land and People" in Anishinaabeg. The land acknowledgement has been crafted with the assistance of the Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba, and has wonderful artwork by Roslyn Boucha, a Anishinaabe / German Settler artist of the Animakee Wa Zhing First Nation. This artwork was originally commission during the 2022-23 school year by the Manitoba Catholic Schools.

This is Roslyn's description of the artwork:

"This illustration is my love letter to the land just as I believe a land acknowledgement should be; an act of reciprocity and a commitment to care for the land just as the land cares for us. Referencing the woodland art style, I included flora and fauna from across Turtle Island that has been integral to Indigenous groups since time immemorial, as well as cultural references to First Nations, Inuit, and our Metis relatives. The overall shape of the design references water as our life giver, flowing from the bottom of the page through to the infinity symbol and Creator's eye at the centre of the star blanket. I chose not to include human shapes in this piece. Not because we are not an integral part of this system, but because we are included as the viewer, within the words, and within the shapes and stories throughout the image. A gentle reminder that we are not separate from the land. We are the land and this story is about us."

NEW Announcements for the Sundays of Advent connecting the theme of Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope and Advent

Here are announcements for Sundays of December 1, 8, 15, 22 that link the theme of Advent to the pilgrimage of hope by reflecting on the journey of preparation, repentance, joy, and trust. Each Sunday invites parishioners to consider their role as pilgrims awaiting Christ's coming and encourages them to deepen their faith in anticipation of the Jubilee Year 2025. We hope that you will read them aloud as we draw near to the Year of Jubilee!

Sunday, December 1, 2024 - First Sunday of Advent: Pilgrims of Hope Begin Their Journey

As we enter the holy season of Advent, we are invited to join together in a journey of anticipation and preparation. Advent is a time to prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate the coming of Christ—both His birth at Christmas and His eventual return in glory. This year, as we begin our Advent journey, we also begin our participation in the Pilgrimage of Hope, a special initiative that prepares us for the Jubilee Year 2025.

The Pilgrims of Hope are those of us who, as the Church, are called to walk together, like pilgrims, through this season of waiting and watching. Just as pilgrims set out on a journey with a purpose, we too are called to make this Advent a pilgrimage of hope. A hope that guides us through this season, a hope that fuels our hearts to long for Christ's coming and to renew our commitment to living in His light.

In today's Gospel (Luke 21:25-28. 34-36), Jesus speaks about the need for vigilance and preparation. "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy... Be vigilant at all times...." These words remind us that Advent is not only about preparing for Christmas but also about remaining alert to the ways God is coming into our lives today. Just as the pilgrims make their way to holy sites, we are invited to make our hearts ready, to remain awake, and to be prepared for Christ's arrival in every moment of our lives.

As we begin our pilgrimage of hope, let us ask ourselves: How can I be more alert, more awake, more prepared for Christ's coming? How can I walk with hope this Advent? May we take the first steps today and continue in faith through the weeks ahead.



REMINDER Jubilee 2025 Pilgrims of Hope: What is a Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is a significant period of celebration and forgiveness observed every 25 years in the Catholic Church. This sacred time provides a unique opportunity for spiritual renewal, where individuals and communities can reflect on their faith, seek forgiveness, and restore relationships. The essence of the Jubilee is rooted in the themes of mercy and hope, inviting everyone to partake in the grace of God and the joy of reconciliation. Pope Francis has called for a year of jubilee with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope" The 2025 Jubilee will officially open on December 24, 2024, at 19:00 with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square, Vatican City. The rite of the Opening of the Holy Door will follow. For the faithful around the world, the local diocesan Masses are to be held on December 29, 2024.

On this same day, every Cathedral and co-Cathedral worldwide will celebrate a special Mass, presided over by the local Bishop, to mark the beginning of the Jubilee.

To mark this significant event, Archbishop Albert LeGatt, D.D. will celebrate Mass on December 29th, 2024, at 3:00 p.m. at the Saint Boniface Cathedral. All are invited to join in the opening of the Jubilee Year. Save the date!



NEW "TEACH US TO PRAY" - Document in Preparation of Jubilee 2025

A Brief Introduction - As we move closer to the Jubilee of 2025, Pope Francis wants 2024 to be dedicated to prayer. Thus, he is inviting the whole Church to a time of intense commitment in preparation for the Opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's in Rome, on December 24.

The Jubilee will involve not only the city of Rome, but will extend far beyond, as God's mercy is proclaimed to the whole world, thus becoming a great opportunity for evangelization. As Christians, we are invited to bear witness as authentic "Pilgrims of Hope" walking toward the Lord, who opens his merciful and forgiving arms to us, as well as to our brothers and sisters who are still waiting for the Gospel to be proclaimed to them.

Prepared by the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization, "Teach Us to Pray", is a resource aide, inspired by the magisterium of Pope Francis, intended to be used by the faithful during this time of preparation for the opening of the Holy Door. NEW Canadian Archbishop appointed to Catholic Near East Welfare Association board

Archbishop will focus on relationship building with Christians in conflict zones Ottawa – The Most Rev. Richard Smith, the Catholic Archbishop of Edmonton, has been appointed to the international board of trustees for the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, the papal organization that responds to the needs of Eastern churches throughout the world.

The 65-year-old Archbishop from Edmonton, Alberta will serve a three-year term on the New York-based board. He has also been appointed to CNEWA's Canadian board.

Archbishop Smith currently serves as President of the Catholic Bishops of Alberta and the Northwest Territories. The archbishop is also a member of the Canadian Catholic Indigenous Council at the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops and chair of the ad hoc committee on Indigenous issues. He previously served as president of the CCCB and as general coordinator of Pope Francis' 2022 visit to Canada. Archbishop Smith says his work on the CNEWA board of trustees will be informed by his experience working and building relationships with Indigenous peoples. "We've

recognized that reconciliation happens one relationship at a time. We need to build relationships based on mutual knowledge and trust. Trust is probably the first thing to go in a war zone and in these conflict areas. We must recover, recapture, trust and a willingness to work together for the greater good," Archbishop Smith said.




