***NEW* The Good Shepherd Campaign 2024 – For the Life of the Church!**

During this second week of the **2024 Good Shepherd Campaign**, we invite you to visit the Archdiocese's website to watch the video of Archbishop LeGatt and our five seminarians ([click here](#)).

The cost to support a seminarian is about \$45,000 per year. This includes accommodation and food, tuition, medical insurance and a monthly stipend. For international seminarians, it is also a question of legal fees and transportation to bring him from abroad. At least twice during his studies, we pay for a trip home to see his family.

The cost to bring in an international priest is about \$20,000. This cost includes legal fees, travel, two and a half months' salary paid by the Archdiocese during his enculturation, language classes if needed, and an allowance for him to stock up on supplies for his first winter here.

***NEW* SAVE THE DATE!!! Jubilee 2025 – Pilgrims of Hope – December 29, 2024**

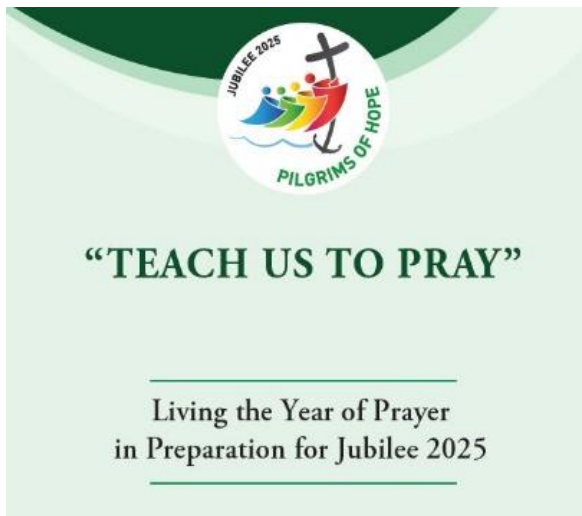
The Jubilee Year 2025 will begin with the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve, December 24, 2024. On December 29th, the Holy Door of the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, the Cathedral of Rome, will also be opened by the Holy Father. On this same day, every Cathedral and co-Cathedral worldwide will celebrate a special Mass, presided over by the local Bishop, to mark the beginning of the Jubilee.

To mark this significant event, Archbishop Albert LeGatt, D.D. will celebrate Mass on December 29th, 2024, at 3:00 p.m. at the Saint Boniface Cathedral. All are invited to join in the opening of the Jubilee Year.

***NEW* "TEACH US TO PRAY" – Document in Preparation of Jubilee 2025**

A Brief Introduction - As we move closer to the Jubilee of 2025, Pope Francis wants 2024 to be dedicated to prayer. Thus, he is inviting the whole Church to a time of intense commitment in preparation for the Opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's in Rome, on December 24. The Jubilee will involve not only the city of Rome, but will extend far beyond, as God's mercy is proclaimed to the whole world, thus becoming a great opportunity for evangelization. As Christians, we are invited to bear witness as authentic "Pilgrims of Hope" walking toward the Lord, who opens his merciful and forgiving arms to us, as well as to our brothers and sisters who are still waiting for the Gospel to be proclaimed to them.

Prepared by the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization, "Teach Us to Pray", is a resource aide, inspired by the magisterium of Pope Francis, intended to be used by the faithful during this time of preparation for the

opening of the Holy Door. It is an invitation to intensify prayer as a personal dialogue with God.

To help us all prepare for Jubilee 2025, the **Weekly News Bulletin** will be offering tips drawn from *Teach Us to Pray*. This week, we focus on **The Family as a School of Prayer**...

In his Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris Laetitia*, Pope Francis stresses that «moments of family prayer and acts of devotion can be more powerful for evangelization than any catechism class or sermon» (Ap. Ex. *Amoris Laetitia* [AL], March 19, 2016, no. 288), concluding that «only on the basis of this experience will the Church's pastoral care for families enable them to be both domestic churches and a leaven of evangelization in society» (AL, no. 290).

St. John Paul II, in his Apostolic Exhortation *Familiaris Consortio*, recognized the importance of shared prayer in the family, because «in the family the human person is not only brought into being and progressively introduced by means of education into the human community, but by means of the rebirth of baptism and education in the faith the child is also introduced into God's family, which is the Church» (FC, no. 15).

One of the main places where families gather is the dinner table, a powerful opportunity to pray together as a family, thanking the Lord for what we have received and praying for those most in need. Another opportune time is when children rise from bed, or go to bed. A short prayer in the morning and a thankful prayer at night help children recognize the blessings received from the Lord. 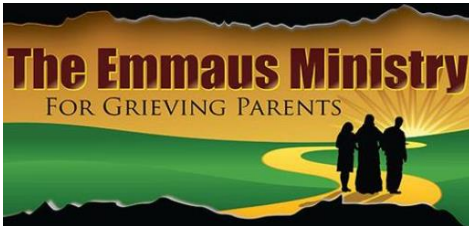

Award-winning Winnipeg filmmaker Bisong Taiwo invites players to embark on a spiritual journey with the official release of Sainthood, a cozy, Catholic-themed strategy game steeped in African folklore. Available now on Steam and Xbox, Sainthood places players in the role of a nun stranded on an enigmatic island with only 33 days to fulfill her journey toward serving her community and growing her faith. With the community already rallying around the game’s themes of faith and kindness, Sainthood has received enthusiastic early feedback. “Sainthood has been a labor of love,” said Taiwo, “and I’m incredibly moved by the support we’ve received from early

players. We wanted to create a game where players focus on serving others, which feels rare in gaming today. Seeing it resonate with players around the world is inspiring.”

In Sainthood, navigate a beautifully illustrated miniature-like grid representing the island which moves through beautiful seasons and day/night cycles. Immerse yourself in a relaxing, meditative world. Find and free the Angel Spirits known as 'Ehi' who will assist you with building upgrades. But be careful, when night descends, mysterious evil spirits known as the 'Shetani' emerge, hungry for your Faith.

As you interact with the custodians of each building—such as the Prioress in the Convent—learn snippets of Kongo culture and history, and the stories behind several saints from Africa and all over the world.

“Most video games that deal directly with the Christian faith typically fall into the realm of parodies, making them controversial, or use the faith as part of a larger strategy to dominate and subjugate, as is the case with 4X Strategy games,” says Taiwo, creator of Sainthood. “I thought it would be a great idea to build a non-violent strategy game where the focus is on helping and serving others rather than conquering and controlling them.”

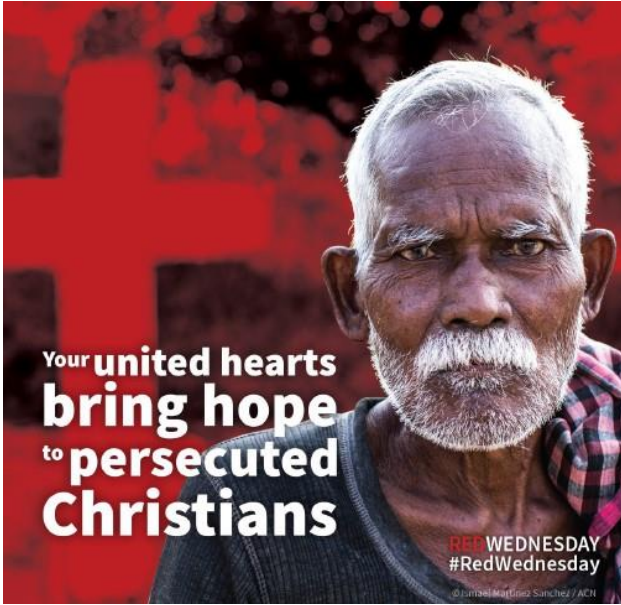

***NEW* Red Wednesday - In solidarity with persecuted Christians around the world - November 20, 2024**

On November 20, Aid to the Church in Need Canada (ACN) will mark Red Wednesday, an international event during which churches and other important buildings will be illuminated in red. The colour is reminiscent of the blood of Christian martyrs, and gives AED the opportunity to point out that many Christians around the world are persecuted simply because of their faith.

“A new report, *Persecuted and Forgotten? A report on Christians oppressed because of their faith* sums up the situation of Christians in 18 countries. It shows that, in general, persecution of Christians is on the rise,” points out Marie-Claude Lalonde, National Director of AED Canada. “In Pakistan, we’re seeing an increase in religious content against minorities, including Christians, in school textbooks. In North Korea, it is estimated that between 50,000 and 70,000 Christians are imprisoned, strictly because they are Christians. Then, in Central America, Daniel Ortega’s government in Nicaragua is firing red-hot bullets at the Church. As a result, members of the clergy and religious communities have been forced into exile, arbitrarily detained, Catholic media have been banned and teaching

institutions have been closed.”

For nearly a decade, the AED Canada office has been inviting Canadian Catholics to stand in solidarity with their brothers and sisters in the faith. “More and more people are learning about this human rights issue, and want to show their solidarity by organizing activities. It’s very encouraging, and I already thank all those who will take the time to do something to mark Red Wednesday.”

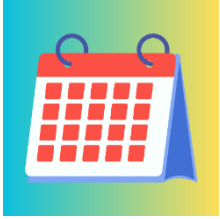

Reflections for the separated/divorced

Loss can trigger anger – In addition to the loss of the marriage, people lose many things in divorce, including material belongings, important relationships, and intangibles such as security, love, peace of mind and identity. Experts often talk about "inordinate attachments", where we hang on too tightly to people, places, things, dreams, hopes, and expectations. We can become sick with emotion and anger at the fear of losing them. Ask God to help you do what is necessary and prudent to preserve them, to accept what you cannot control, and to let go of the anger. – Rose Sweet, *Surviving Divorce*
