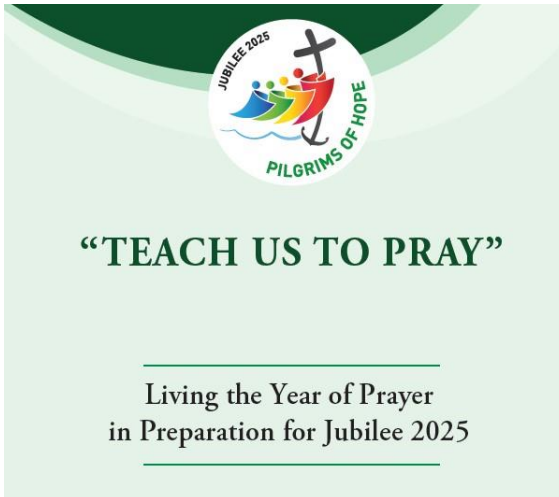
***NEW* The Good Shepherd Campaign 2024 – For the Life of the Church!**

***NEW* “TEACH US TO PRAY” – Document in Preparation of Jubilee 2025**

A Brief Introduction - As we move closer to the Jubilee of 2025, Pope Francis wants 2024 to be dedicated to prayer. Thus, he is inviting the whole Church to a time of intense commitment in preparation for the Opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's in Rome, on December 24. The Jubilee will involve not only the city of Rome, but will extend far beyond, as God's mercy is proclaimed to the whole world, thus becoming a great opportunity for evangelization. As Christians, we are invited to bear witness as authentic “Pilgrims of Hope” walking toward the Lord, who opens his merciful and forgiving arms to us, as well as to our brothers and sisters who are still waiting for the Gospel to be proclaimed to them.

Prepared by the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization, “Teach Us to Pray”, is a resource aide, inspired by the magisterium of Pope Francis, intended to be used by the faithful during this time of preparation for the

opening of the Holy Door. It is an invitation to intensify prayer as a personal dialogue with God.

To help us all prepare for Jubilee 2025, the **Weekly News Bulletin** will be offering tips drawn from **Teach Us to Pray**. This week, we focus on **Eucharistic Adoration**, a very intimate form of prayer and encounter with Christ...

As belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species (Cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraph 1379). Eucharistic Adoration makes it possible to prolong and give more space for a personal encounter with Jesus truly present in the Eucharistic species outside the time of Mass.

While waiting for the Blessed Sacrament to be exposed, let's recollect ourselves in silence, listening in prayer to what He wants to say to us. Once Christ is exposed, singing and incense can help us to recognize the specialness of the moment. As we adore Jesus, let's also invoke the Holy Spirit to enlighten us with the gift of faith, so we may recognize the real presence of the Lord.

Above all, let's make ourselves fully present to Jesus, bringing in silent prayer our petitions, our joys, our burdens, our very selves to Him. He knows us better than we know ourselves. We can confidently enter into a dialogue with Jesus, as His heart speaks to our hearts. Use this time to make an examination of conscience, to prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation. The Lord knows our wounds and our shortcomings. Let's allow ourselves to place everything in His Presence, knowing His mercy can embrace our whole being.

SUGGESTED WORDING FOR A PARISH BULLETIN ANNOUNCEMENT:

***NEW* Tips for Eucharistic Adoration**

Allow yourself to be silent, to put yourself completely in His Presence. Share your joys and burdens with Him. What is He saying to you today? Confidently bring your petitions to Him – for yourself, your family and friends, for the Church.

If Eucharistic Adoration is accompanied by singing, sing joyfully! Savor the moment.

Use this time to make an examination of conscience, to prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation.

“Towards a Narrative of Hope”: An International Interfaith Symposium on Palliative Care

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Pontifical Academy for Life, in collaboration with other partners, organized an International Interfaith Symposium on Palliative Care titled “Towards a Narrative of Hope,” which took place in Toronto on 21-23 May 2024. The goal was to build a strong advocacy network in Canada and internationally and, together,

develop a strategic framework for future action.

In a written message, Pope Francis warmly encouraged the participants to persevere in their commitment to promoting palliative care, which is an expression of compassion and respect for the infinite dignity of every person.

With over 110 participants from diverse backgrounds from across Canada and internationally, presentations explored educating and promoting a culture of social responsibility in palliative care. Experts in ethics, medicine, healthcare, policy, law, communication, and pastoral care deliberated on the challenges and successes of effective strategies to relieve suffering during illness and dying and ways to provide appropriate human accompaniment to improve patients’ and their families’ quality of life and well-being. An interfaith panel featuring different religious and cultural perspectives, including an Indigenous perspective, highlighted the importance of faith and culture in supporting the needs of the sick and dying and alleviating their physical, spiritual, and emotional suffering.

A Post-Symposium Working Group gathered insights throughout the Symposium. The Working Group published a post-symposium statement and recommendations, opening a path forward for future action.

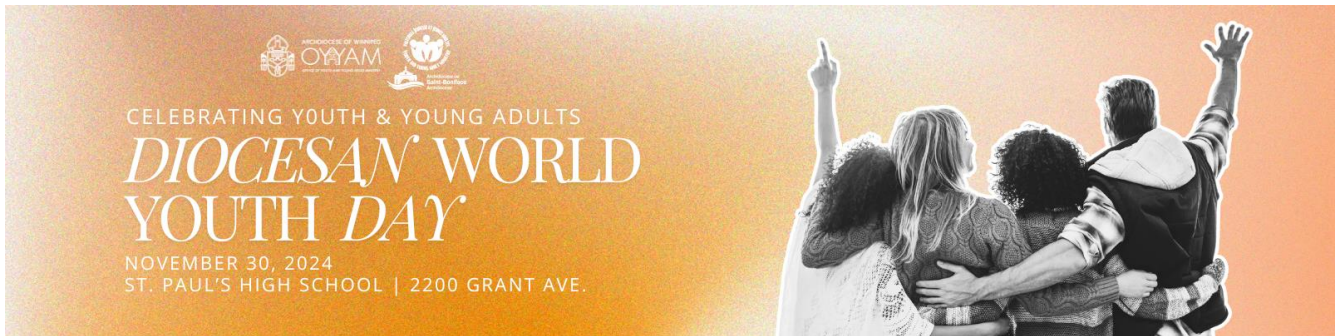

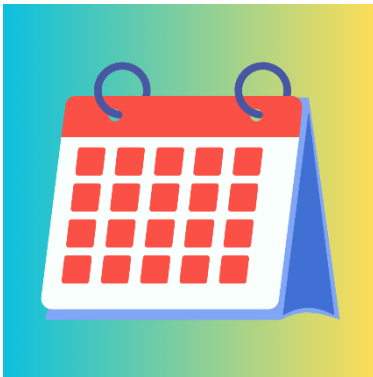

Walking Together (Truth and Reconciliation)

New Paths for the Churches & Indigenous Peoples – November 1 & 2, 2024

How do we create a new story together? The Centre on the Churches, Truth, and Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples is hosting a conference exploring reconciliation and decolonization in the church and the academy through conversations and workshops.

On Friday, November 1 at 7 PM, we gather for a panel discussion and reception in the amphitheater at Saint Paul University **IN OTTAWA**.
