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Forming and Revitalizing a Parish Pastoral Council

"It is increasingly clear that in a parish, the two key sources and prime movers are the Pastors and the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC)". Archbishop LeGatt, April 2018

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Mission

Assists in the formation, implementation, revitalization, and ongoing support of Parish Pastoral Councils (PPC) in the Archdiocese of Saint-Boniface.

<u>Vision</u>

That each parish in the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface have an active Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) focused on the particular needs of the parish and its Mission and Vision.

Forming and Revitalizing a PPC is the first step toward revitalising the parish. Whether a parish already has a Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and would like to revitalize it, or whether there is no existing PPC, the following are steps that guide the process. The Archdiocesan Committee for the Renewal and Growth of Parish Pastoral Councils (PPC) exists to assist parishes with the process.

The primary ingredients are Prayer and Discernment.

Definitions and Conventions

Use of masculine or feminine: When using the masculine in this document it could also represent the feminine. It is not intended to mean only the male gender.

Pastor: The word Pastor in this document also means the Parish Life Director.

Parish Pastoral Council (PPC): A group of parishioners who exist in co-responsibility with the pastor to foster pastoral activity in accordance with, and which expresses the mission of, the parish.

Pastoral: relates to the spiritual, emotional, social, and physical well-being of the people.

Parishioner: is a person that has been baptized in the Catholic faith and is a registered member of the parish, in good standing.

Renewal and Growth Committee (R&G) is an Archdiocesan service which actively assists parishes in the Archdiocese of Saint Boniface in the development (Revitalization) and implementation (Formation) of Parish Pastoral Councils (PPC).

R&G Team: Specific members of the Renewal and Growth Committee designated to work with a particular parish.

Pillar: Refers to the overarching core essentials (categories) of a PPC under which ministries are grouped. (See Appendix 5 in Upper Room document)

What is an Ad Hoc Committee?

An Ad Hoc Committee is a group of 8 – 12 people, including the Pastor, gathered for a short term to reach specific GOALS. It is important that the Ad Hoc committee is representative of the parish (gender, culture, age).

Parishes With A PPC

- 1. To open the dialogue as to the needs of the parish, the Archbishop and member(s) of the R&G team meet with the Pastor.
- 2. R&G team member(s) then meets with the Pastor and the existing PPC members to learn more about the current situation and the needs of their Parish.
- 3. After determining the need for revitalization, the R&G team will make a presentation to the PPC.
- 4. Pastor and members of the PPC invite parishioners to attend an informational meeting. These parishioners may be involved in the parish in one way or another and have talents, charisms, and experiences that would be valuable.
- 5. The R&G team presents the Revitalization Process at the informational meeting.
- 6. Those parishioners and current PPC members willing to remain involved in the revitalization process form the Ad Hoc Committee. The committee should be no greater than 12 members plus the Pastor.

Parishes <u>Without</u> A PPC:

- 1. To open the dialogue as to the needs of the parish, the Archbishop and member(s) of the R&G team meet with the Pastor.
- 2. Pastor invites parishioners to attend an informational meeting. These parishioners may be involved in the parish in one way or another and have talents, charisms, and experiences that would be valuable.
- 3. The R&G team presents the Formation Process at the informational meeting.
- 4. Those parishioners willing to remain involved form the Ad Hoc Committee. The committee should be no greater than 12 members plus the Pastor.

 - Communications Subcommittee
 - Survey Subcommittee
 - b. Understand the roles of the Subcommittees
 - c. Determine an Ad Hoc chairperson
- A brief overview of the role of the Ad Hoc chairperson and the three Subcommittees is presented. The participants are then invited to choose the Subcommittee that interests them.
- 7. Break-out Session.
- 8. Participants are called back together to review the <u>Flow of Relationships</u> chart. (pg7)
- 9. General discussion/questions.
- 10. An Ad Hoc Committee chairperson is selected, and each Subcommittee is asked to choose a leader.
- 11. Set a date for the Launch Weekend. Survey weekend date is 6-7 weeks from the Launch.
- 12. Each Subcommittee determines their individual meeting dates.
- 13. Set next Ad Hoc meeting date to review the draft prayer, confirm launch and survey dates, and review communication assignments.

Ad Hoc Committee Roles and Responsibilities

Ad Hoc Committee Chairperson

- Ensures that each meeting is planned effectively and that matters are dealt with in an orderly, efficient manner.
- Oversees the Subcommittees by keeping up to date of all progress.
- Maintains communication with the R&G team.

Three Subcommittees

Prayer Subcommittee

- Formulate a "Parish Prayer" for the successful Formation or Revitalization of the PPC. This prayer should reflect <u>your</u> parish strengths, needs & goals.
- Present the prayer to the Ad Hoc for input and blessing before the prayer cards are printed.

Communications Subcommittee

- Assure that the flow of information to the parishioners continues throughout the Revitalization process.

Survey Subcommittee


- Decide how the survey will be distributed.
- Conduct the survey.

Survey Weekend(s)

• At the time when Mass would normally start, 10 minutes are taken to conduct the in-person survey before the liturgy begins. The survey may also be available in other means as determined by the subcommittee.

After Survey Weekend

• Survey Subcommittee with the help of other Ad Hoc committee members, gathers and classifies responses based on Essential Elements

Final Meeting Ad Hoc, PPC and R&G Team

- Survey results/priorities presented
- In parishes without a PPC, the Ad Hoc Committee members are invited to become the initial PPC members.
- Ad Hoc is dissolved

Revitalization and Formation

Parishes with PPC - Revitalization:

The Ad Hoc Committee hands over the organized survey responses to the PPC. Using the feedback presented and the priorities indicated, the PPC reorganizes accordingly. This marks the end of the Ad Hoc Committee's mandate.

Parishioners are invited to become members of the PPC. As well, members of the Ad Hoc Committee who were already on the PPC may remain to form the new PPC. See Upper Room Guidelines. – (<u>https://www.archsaintboniface.ca/</u>)

Parishes without PPC - Formation:

The Ad Hoc Committee members are invited to remain to form core group the PPC. The new PPC will continue to invite additional parishioners to join to a maximum of 12 members. The priorities raised in the survey will guide the PPC on where to begin to formulate an Action Plan. The Upper Room (Guidelines) document provides the information for the formation of the PPC.

APPENDICES

APPENDIX 1 – Prayer Subcommittee Guide

Overview of the Tasks / Responsibilities

- Formulate a "Parish Prayer" for the successful Formation or Revitalization of the PPC. This prayer should reflect your parish strengths, needs and goals.
- Present draft to whole committee to agree on as a final copy.
- Print Prayer Cards (4"x6"/10x15cm) with the newly formulated prayer. (Prayer card examples are available.)
- Distribute prayer cards to all parishioners before masses on the "Launch Weekend".
 - Prayer cards may be distributed to other organizations in your parish asking them to pray for the success of this initiative and to encourage members to participate (Knights of Columbus, prayers groups, catechetics, Catholic Women's League...)
 - Prayer cards should be available for a few weekends, assuring that all parishioners receive a copy.
- The Prayer should be in every bulletin from Launch Week forward and recited at every Mass. An appropriate time for the recitation of your Parish Prayer is during the Prayers of the Faithful (Intentions).

Note:

*The Prayer Subcommittee works very closely with the Survey and Communications Subcommittees to assure that all information is received by the parishioners (bulletins and all available media supports).

*The Prayer Subcommittee leader keeps the ad hoc committee chairperson informed of all progress.

APPENDIX 2 – Communications Subcommittee

It should be noted that the Communications Subcommittee is the only Subcommittee that becomes an ongoing Pillar of the PPC.

The Communications Subcommittee is responsible for:

- Preparing announcements and assigning presenters for each mass. A presenter could be your pastor, the PPC chairperson, chairperson of the Ad Hoc committee, the appointed spokespersons from the Prayer and Survey Subcommittee. All members of the Ad Hoc committee and PPC should be considered as potential presenters.
- Having announcements made in the appropriate language(s) before every Mass.
- Preparing bulletin inserts and providing them to the bulletin editor in a timely manner.
- Identifying the most effective social media for communicating with the greatest number of parishioners.
- Communicating directly with well-established parish groups such as the Knights of Columbus, Catholic Women's League, Prayer Groups and Adult Faith Formation.
- Creating a poster announcing the date of the survey and the questions that will be asked. A smaller version of the poster could also be included in the bulletin.

Following Survey Week: Communications Subcommittee will see to it that, along with the Survey results, a thank you to the parishioners for their participation should appear in the bulletin as well as a thank you to the Ad Hoc committee members.

The Communications Subcommittee coordinates with the Prayer and Survey Subcommittees to ensure that all information gets to the parishioners in a timely and cohesive manner.

The survey questions will be introduced in Week 2. Sharing the survey questions prior to the Survey Weekend gives the parishioners a chance to think about their responses to these important questions.

It is important that there is a consistent exchange of information among the Ad Hoc chairperson and the leaders of the 3 subcommittees regarding the information to be shared with the parishioners each week.

Announcements

Announcements should be made before each Mass and in the languages spoken in your parish. With the permission of your pastor, these announcements may be made by Pastor, PPC or Ad Hoc Committee Chair, or the leader of the Prayer or Survey subcommittees. All members of the Ad Hoc committee and the existing PPC should considered for making announcements. This helps the parishioners to get to know who is involved.

The Survey questions as well as the Prayer should appear in every bulletin in addition to weekly bulletin inserts.

Note: *The Communications Sub-committee leader keeps the ad hoc committee chairperson informed of all progress.

Announcements and Bulletin Inserts (7 Weeks)

If you wish, these may be used verbatim by your speaker before the mass and bulletin inserts may be copied and pasted into your bulletin and onto your social media platforms.

WEEK 1: ANOUNCEMENT:

After the survey responses have been submitted, the committee will analyze the responses. This will help determine the Parish Pastoral Council's (PPC) priorities and plans for the future. Your responses are vital to the success of our endeavour.

APPENDIX 3 – Survey Subcommittee

- 1. A survey is a way of getting feedback by including all parishioners using 3 positive inquiry comments.
 - a. What do you like about our parish right now?
 - b. What would you like to see in our parish?
 - c. Comments:
- 2. Survey Weekend is the date the whole Ad Hoc committee has decided on. 6-7 weeks to accomplish the various steps in this process.
- 3. The Survey sub-committee is responsible for printing the surveys on cardstock paper. Keep in mind to have a large enough piece of paper to allow room for written comments. (half an 8 1/2 x 11"/216x279mm sheet)
- 4. Purchase small pencils to be handed out along with Survey "card". Small/golf pencils can be purchased by the box.
 - a. Decide how the paper surveys will be collected on Survey Weekend. The best way is to have them returned in the collection plate as this prevents people from walking out with them.
 - b. Consider having some surveys available for members who are absent, like the elderly or shut-ins, and find volunteers to bring survey cards to them. It is important for all voices to be heard.
- 5. If you decide to have the survey available on-line, have a member be responsible for setting it up and collecting the responses.

NOTE:

*The Survey sub- committee works very closely with the Prayer and Communications subcommittees to ensure that all information gets to the parishioners (bulletins and all available media supports).

*The Survey subcommittee leader keeps the ad hoc committee chairperson informed of all progress.

SURVEY WEEKEND

- 1. Assign 2 people for each Mass on Survey Sunday to hand out survey cards and pencils as parishioners enter the church and to collect in the manner you decide.
- 2. The designated members arrive on time to hand out survey cards and pencils as parishioners enter the church. These 2 people can also collect survey cards and pencils in the manner they choose (best practice is at collection time).
- 3. Before Mass, the pastor and the chair of the Ad Hoc committee gives a last explanation about the survey and how it will be conducted that day. Encouraging words from the pastor are very helpful, as well as explaining how these survey questions will be collected.
- 4. With your pastor's permission, allow 10 minutes at the normal start time of Mass to complete the surveys. This means Mass will begin 10 minutes later than usual.

- 5. Completed surveys are collected and returned to the Survey committee.
- 6. If you are able, have an online option available. Give instructions for this in the bulletin, on the posters, and/or with the spoken announcements.

ANALYZING SURVEY RESPONSES:

This step should take place as soon as possible after the survey weekend. You may decide to give one more week for responses if you have made the survey available online.

- Survey Committee meets to organize the responses from each question and arrange them in Pillars (categories) – see <u>Appendix 4</u>. A member can enter responses onto a spreadsheet or table. These results provide you with the <u>priorities</u> that have been identified and serve as direction for the PPC.
- 2. Survey committee along with the Ad Hoc members will prepare a summary of the 7-week process and the final results of the survey.

APPENDIX 4 – Pillars (Categories)

EVANGELIZATION PILLAR

- Efforts are made to reach out to the alienated, the inactive, and the unchurched.
- Opportunities are provided for small groups to gather and share faith as it relates to their everyday life.
- Parish renewals, evenings of prayer and/or retreat days are planned to enliven and deepen the faith of the people.
- The parish takes steps to influence the values and decisions of the larger community through prophetic action and works of justice and outreach.

WORSHIP/LITURGY PILLAR

- Competent individuals are responsible for every aspect of liturgical celebrations.
- Quality in music, including instruments, musicians, and hymn selection, enables the assembly to participate in sung prayer.
- All the sacraments are celebrated regularly, with attention given to making them true expressions of the life of the parish.
- Devotional prayer is encouraged but does not interfere with the primary sacramental celebrations of the parish.

FAITH FORMATION (WORD) PILLAR

- The parish Catechetical leader has appropriate education, ability, and experience to provide catechist formation and effective administration of religious education efforts.
- Religious formation or catechesis is planned and evaluated for all in the parish: adults, youth, and children.
- Strengthening marriages and nurturing the life of families are priorities for the parish.
- Assistance in provided to help parents understand their roles as ministries to their children in the formation of Christian values.

COMMUNITY PILLAR

- There is good spirit of working together among parish groups and organizations.
- Programming for parish organizations consistently offers prayer, information, education, entertainment, and hospitality.
- There is an annual review of the purpose, effectiveness, and need for each parish organization.
- The parish collaborates with the neighboring parishes as appropriate to enhance the mission of the Church.

SERVICE PILLAR

• The parish focuses on the needs of the human community, beginning with its own members and extending to the poor and marginalized in the local area, the nation, and the world.

- The parish makes every effort accommodate persons with special needs.
- Programs that minister to the sick, the bereaved and the homebound are ongoing.
- Racial and ethnic harmony, peacemaking and non-violence, respect for life at all stages, and the practice of spiritual and corporal works of mercy are priority areas for study and action in the parish.

STEWARDSHIP PILLAR

- Formation efforts help parishioners understand their baptismal responsibility to steward their gifts, including the gifts of faith and life in the church.
- Parishioners who offer their gifts in service to the parish mission are given adequate training, encouragement, and supervision.
- The parish is not overly dependent on extraordinary fund-raisers to support its ordinary budget.
- The Finance Council reflects persons with interest and experience in budgeting, facilities management, and fundraising and development efforts.

COMMUNICATION PILLAR

PILLAR (This is a new pillar introduced in the revised Upper Room document, November 2024)

Communication is an essential element for the successful implementation of the mission of the parish. It is very important that the flow of information to the parishioners continues as it did during the 7-week Revitalization and Renewal Process. The formation of the Communication Pillar can continue to provide parishioners with ongoing information as to the work of their representatives, the members of the PPC.

Titles such as: DID YOU KNOW?" or "YOUR PPC CORNER" or "WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE?!" are helpful in catching the eye of the readers of your bulletin.

- Your PPC Communication Pillar chair is encouraged to make PPC news/information available to your parishioners at least monthly, in the bulletin and other media outlets.
- Date of upcoming PPC meetings may be published, with an invitation for parishioners to attend.
- A summary of the monthly PPC meeting may be included so that parishioners are kept informed of the PPC's existence and activities.
- Each Pillar could include a list of its ministries and what they do, with an invitation for anyone interested to contact the Pillar's chair.
- Each Pillar and/or ministry may insert news as it comes along. Ex: liturgy, music, youth, hospitality)

INTRODUCTION (after Introductory Rites):

The Presider may briefly explain the significance of the Celebration of Recognition of PPC which will be taking place after the Homily.

OPENING PRAYER:

PRESIDER:

O God, the giver of every perfect gift, by the grace of baptism, you adopt us as Your own and call us to your service.

Strengthen us by Your Holy Spirit to live the Gospel we have embraced.

Deliver us from self-seeking and cause us to work for the common good.

Keep us loyal to Christ in all we set out to accomplish that the praise and glory may be Yours alone.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who live and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

ALL: Amen

<u>RECOGNITION</u> (after the Homily):

PRESIDER: "Let the member of the PPC please come forward."

The names of the PPC member are called out as they come forward and stand before the assembly.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Dear friends, these members of our parish have accepted to serve as an advisory body to the Pastor, and for the parish of (name). In sharing their gifts and wisdom, they have the pastoral needs of this entire faith community at heart. Let us pray for their perseverance in this important service.

COMMITMENT

PRESIDER: addresses and questions the PPC:

My brothers and sisters, you are called to a most important work in our community. Your duty is to foster the pastoral activity of this parish, to help all of us to grow in faithfulness to the Gospel; to be the disciples of Christ that we are called to be.

Because of our knowledge and competence, you have been chosen to share your insights with one another, with your pastor and the whole pastoral team, for the well-being of the entire parish and the building of the kingdom of God.

Therefore, I ask each of you, are you willing to share your insights honestly, with courage and with mutual respect?

PPC members: I am.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Are you committed to work together with openness to the needs of every member of this parish community? <u>PPC members: I am.</u>

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Will you strive to make prayer a part of your daily life, ensuring that in all deliberations you are open to the grace of the Holy Spirit? <u>PPC members</u>: I am.

PRAYER OF BLESSING:

PRESIDER: Let us pray. All pray silently for a moment. *The Presider then extends his hands and continues:*

Ever-living God, You have chosen us to be your beloved people and have gathered us to live in this parish of (name), to proclaim the Gospel of Christ to all people, and to love and serve you in word, worship, and work.

Bestow your blessings upon these members of our Parish Pastoral Council and let their deliberations be pleasing to you. May your Spirit enlighten their minds and guide their actions that they may be renewed in faith, united in love, and bring to fulfillment the work of your Church. For your honour and glory and for the benefit of all your people. Blessed are you Lord God, for ever and ever.

PRESENTATION OF A SYMBOL OF THEIR WORK:

The members of the PPC may receive copy of the Bible, or the Constitution of the PPC, or some other symbol of their work.

<u>PRESIDER</u>: Take to heart your responsibility for the parish community and strive to grow in faithfulness to the Gospel.

PPC members: Amen

GENERAL INTERCESSIONS (Prayer of the faithful)

The members of the PPC return to their places and the General Intercessions follow. These should include an intention for the PPC and for the Parish community. <u>One</u> of the following may be used or adapted:

- Parish Prayer
- That the members of our Parish Pastoral Council may give witness to the presence of Christ by lives manifesting faith, hope and love. We pray to the Lord.
- That the Church, the People of God, may grow in Christ and in the bond of common fellowship. We pray to the Lord.
- That all who are concerned with the welfare of our parish, may open to the movement of the Holy Spirit, and strive to carry out God's will. We pray to the Lord.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: The celebration of the Eucharist continues and concludes as usual. It is appropriate for some of the members of the PPC to present the gifts of bread and wine for the celebration.
